In May 2015, Clinton said "The dream of upward mobility that made this country a model for the world feels further and further out of reach, and many Americans understandably feel frustrated, even angry." She is committed to roll back the tax cuts on the rich, which have been paid for by the middle class.

"We cannot – must not – ever forget that the rights and opportunities we enjoy as women today were not just bestowed upon us by some benevolent ruler. They were fought for, agonized over, marched for, jailed for and even died for by brave and persistent women and men who came before us."
