The summer of 2016 is turning out to be the busiest summer ever for NOW activists. Not only did we celebrate our 50th anniversary with a great conference and fabulous gala, we were thrilled to see our NOW PAC-supported candidate for president, Hillary Clinton, officially nominated at the Democratic National Conference with many NOW members in attendance in Philadelphia or glued to the proceedings around the country listening to the glass ceiling shattering. Congratulations goes to the hundreds of NOW activists who phoned, canvassed, rallied and contributed to the MsPresidentNOW campaign to make it all happen.

#### Ms. President NOW at the National NOW Conference

Hillary and the MsPresidentNOW campaign were addressed in several exciting events at the conference including a workshop called: "Looking at the 2016 Feminist Political Landscape" which included discussion of NOW PAC's strategy to elect the first woman president, emphasizing swing states and states with key Senate and House races.

The PAC Lunch Plenary focused on Hillary's campaign and NOW PAC's MsPresidentNOW work to help elect her. Speakers were NOW PAC members Bonnie Grabenhofer and Jacqueline Kozin, and Mini Timmaraju (HFA), and Jamia Wilson, with moderator Eleanor Smeal and Woman of Impact Award Honoree Senator Barbara Mikulski.

At the NOW PAC Party Poster Session participants had the opportunity to view posters highlighting some of the excellent Ms. President NOW work done by NOW activists. Members viewed items representing their work like pictures, flyers, and media and talked to the organizers about their events and tips for success. Their Tips for Success were compiled into a handout.

# Democratic National Convention – Hillary Accepts Nomination!

The officers, political director, and many NOW activists participated in the Democratic National Convention as delegates and/or participants in other exciting events to celebrate Hillary Clinton accepting the nomination – the historic milestone – as the first woman nominated for president for any major party! In addition, it was a thrill to see many of our favorite NOW PAC endorsed senators and representatives on stage at the convention and speaking at other events around Philadelphia including the fabulous Equali*Tea*. It was a lot of fun to celebrate with Pennsylvania NOW and other NOW activists

at the Happy Hour hosted by PA NOW. And, of course, we passed out NOW4Hillary and ERA buttons – they were very popular!

### **MsPresidentNOW Coordinators and Volunteers**

Following the conference a number of new volunteers joined MsPresidentNOW, and updated volunteer lists were sent to the MsPresidentNOW coordinators and/or state presidents in their respective states. Emails were sent with suggested election activities and resources.

#### MsPresidentNOW Activities

Here are some highlights of what NOW activists have been doing to help Hillary win in the general election.

- At the Indiana NOW State Conference there will be a panel on What's at Stake in this Election
  with Marcella Jewell, the Indiana State Director for Hillary for America, and Bonnie Grabenhofer
  and Gay Bruhn discussing Hillary and the MsPresidentNOW campaign. Afterwards one of the
  breakout groups will create "action ideas" for Indiana NOW PAC and electing Hillary.
- Illinois NOW is gearing up to for the election and to help, Bonnie Grabenhofer will be the keynote speaker at the upcoming **Illinois NOW State Conference**.
- Gay Bruhn and other Illinois NOW activists are going to the Women for Hillary Illinois Summit
  with key female Illinois elected officials and special guests to show their support for Hillary and
  learn how women can lead in this election. Gay Bruhn is also hosting a debate watch party and
  planning other events.
- Barb Miller from Peoria NOW (IL) reports that their chapter has been registering low-income,
   Black voters from public housing and was pleased that they're supporting Hillary. (As voter registrars, of course, they didn't discuss candidates, but the voters do.) They also did training recently and are joining others at the exciting Women for Hillary Illinois Summit.
- Toni Van Pelt, West Pinellas NOW, reports that they are housing a Hillary fellow/organizer who is staying until Nov. 15 and their home is being used as a staging site for events. Toni has been identified as a **GrassTops woman** and she's working on the Democratic Women's Club of Florida committee, doing various jobs. She is also doing VAN data entry and voter registration.
- Barbara McDaniel reports that Alaska Ms. President NOW volunteers have had a great time
  promoting Hillary at the Alaska State Fair for several weeks during August and September.
  Many enthusiastic supporters visited their booth and had their photo taken with Hillary or the
  famous life-size Hillary cutout.
- Patricia Ireland reports that they had a great launch for the Dade County NOW 67 day countdown with National NOW President Terry O'Neill, FL NOW President Terry Sanders, National NOW Board member Meredith Ockman along with 30 chapter members!

- Cindy Wolfe Boynton reports that Connecticut NOW's recent meeting addressed: "How You Can Help Hillary Clinton & Other Feminist Candidates Get Elected in November" with a surrogate from Hillary for America. CT NOW recently ran an awesome phone bank and has also been going gangbusters with social media. They have shared their work for use by other chapters!
- Rebecca Talley, Contra Costa NOW, is organizing phone banking in October and expects about a
  dozen phoners.
- Jacqueline Kozin, CT NOW, is organizing phone banking and canvassing in New Hampshire.
- **NOW PAC phoners** across the country will be calling NOW members in targeted states focusing first on presidential battleground states with key senate races.

# Voter Registration, etc.

Now is a good time to be sure that people are registered to vote and help register others. NOW members are usually good about registering to vote, but it would be good to check, especially with some of the changes (like purging voter rolls) that may have occurred. Reminders to members in your state would be helpful.

It's also a good time to identify dates and processes for voter registration, requesting absentee ballots, and early voting and share that information.

#### **Debate Watch Parties**

Debate watch parties are a fun way to regenerate enthusiasm of existing volunteers and recruit new volunteers. The current schedule is:

First presidential debate: Mon. Sept. 26
 Vice presidential debate: Tues. Oct. 4
 Second presidential debate: Sun. Oct. 9
 Third presidential debate: Wed, Oct. 19

Hillary for America is hiring staff in every state. Be sure to connect with them to find out what's happening and how you and NOW volunteers can best help. Offices are opening and training, organizing meetings and other events are happening.
