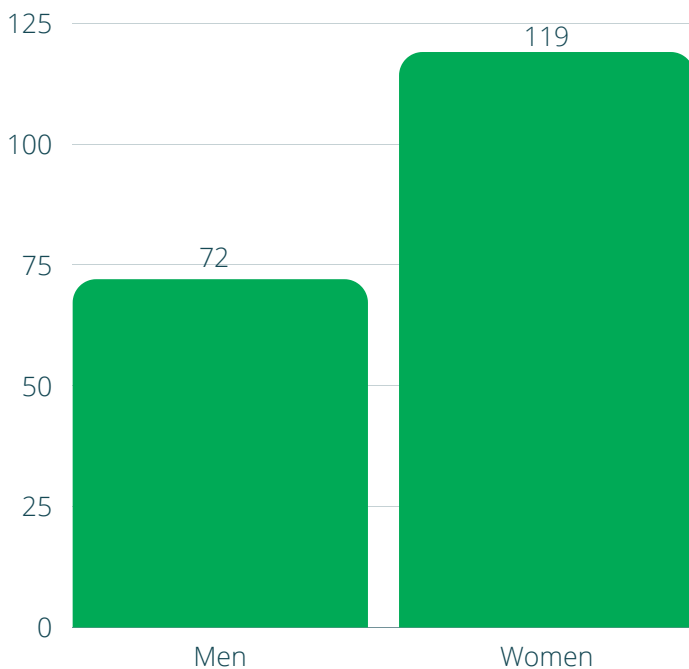
### NOW PAC Core Issues

The NOW PAC supports candidates based on their commitment to feminist principles and NOW’s core issues. We aggressively seek, support, and endorse feminist candidates at the national level. Unlike other PACs, the NOW PAC does not rely on polls to evaluate candidates for endorsement. Because many challengers have to run more than once, support in their early races is essential to recruiting feminist candidates to run. Candidates must be feminist leaders and strong supporters of women’s rights issues including, but not limited to:

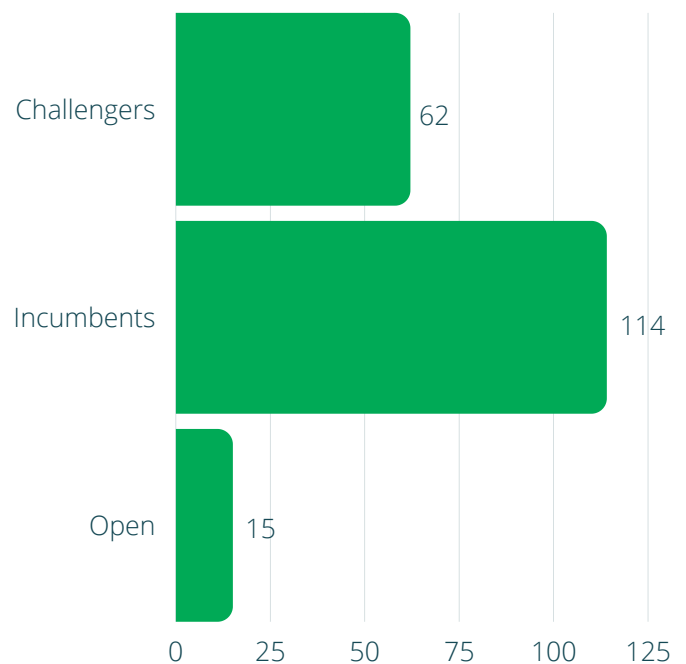
- Reproductive Rights and Justice

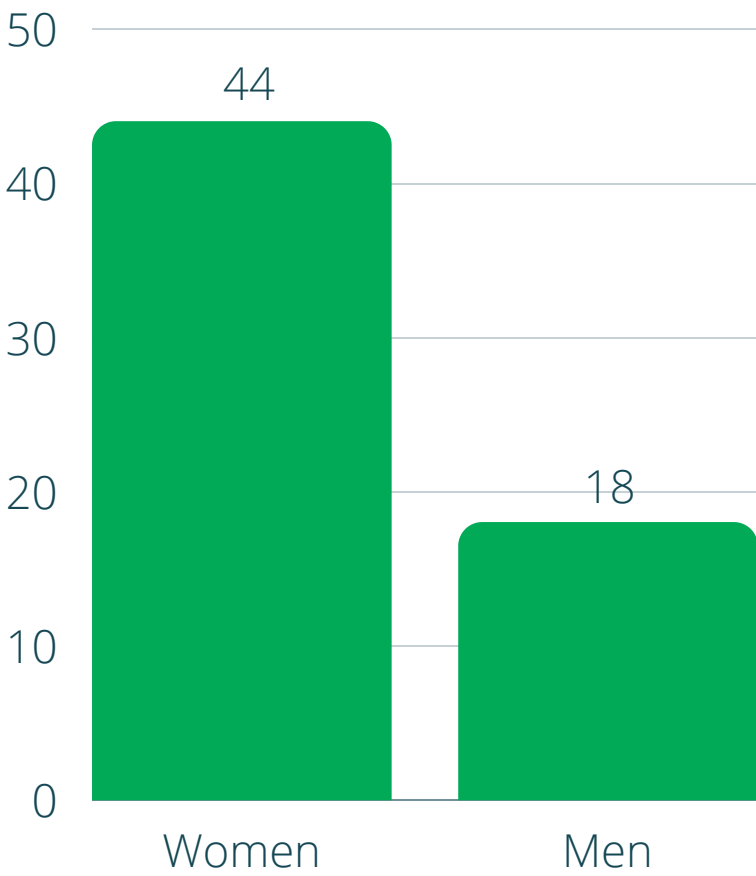
Men and Women



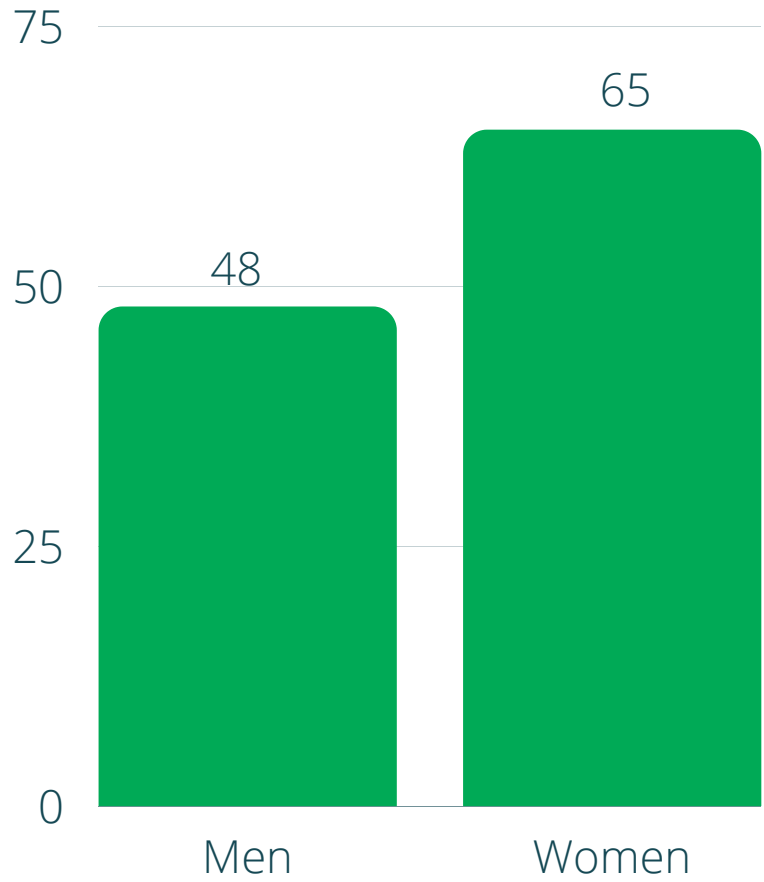
Challengers, Incumbents, and Open



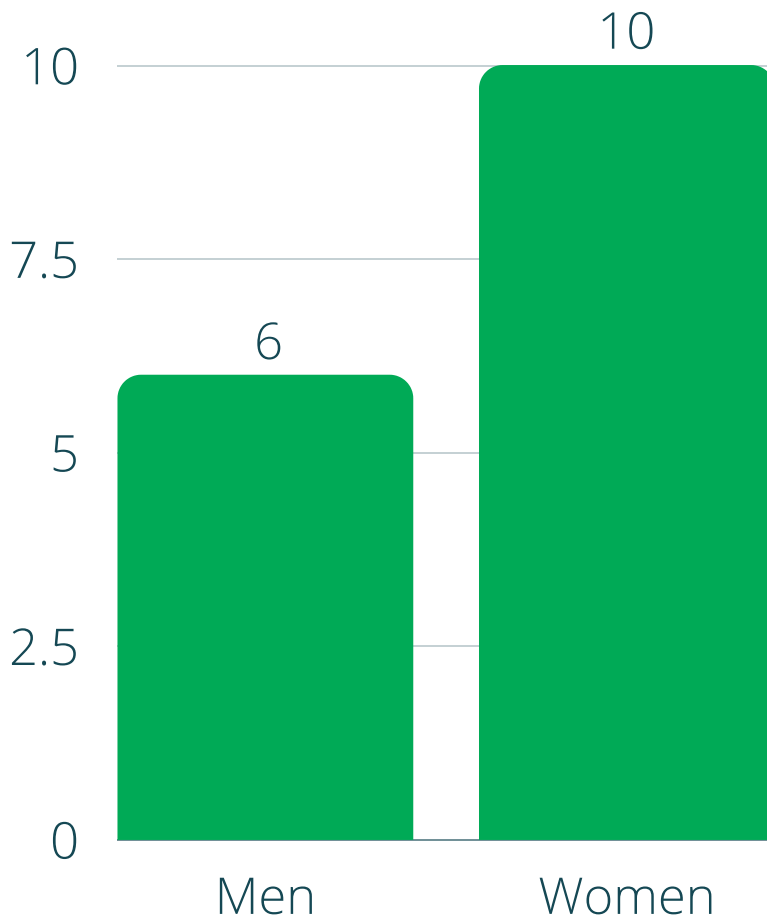
**Male and Female Challengers**

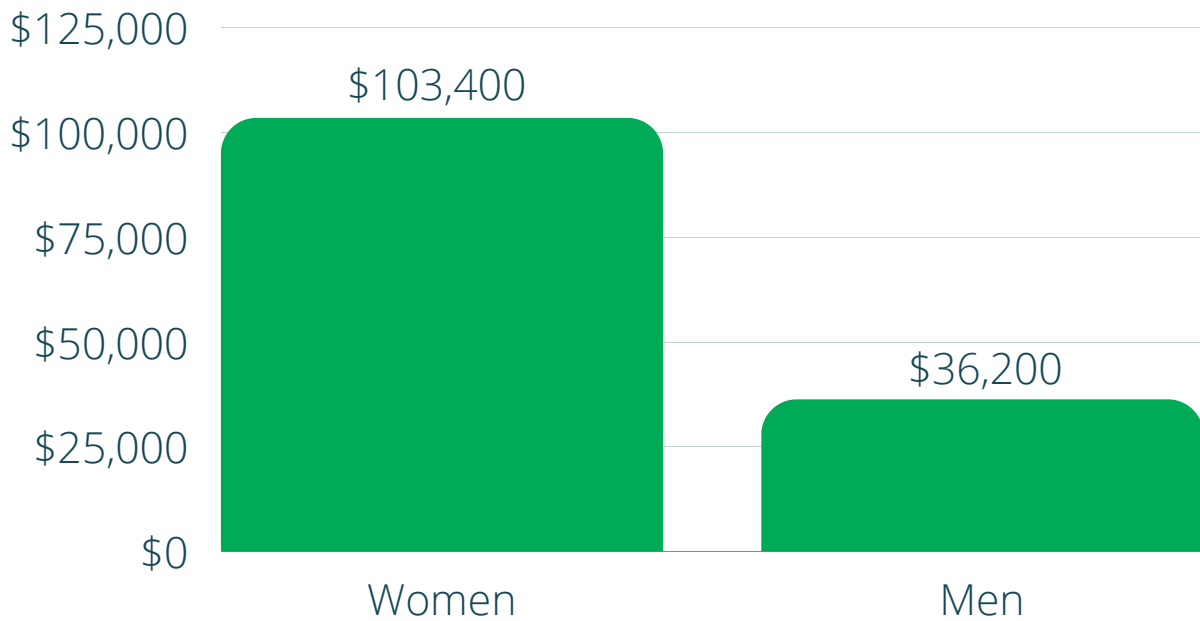
## Contributions

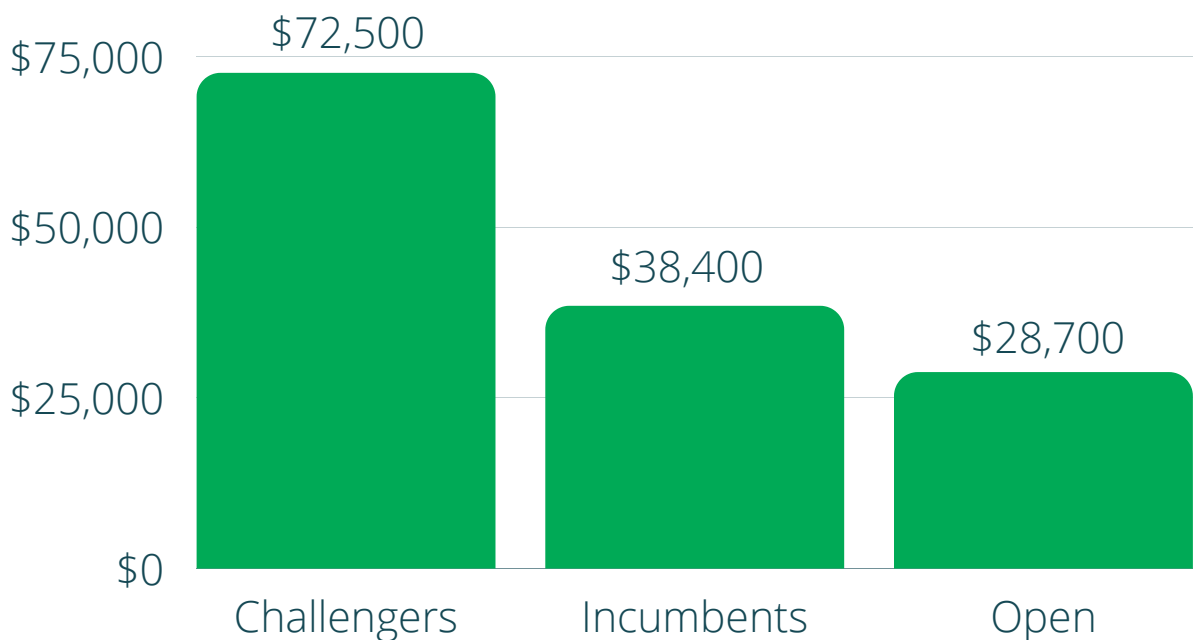

#### Contributions to Challengers, Incumbents, and Open

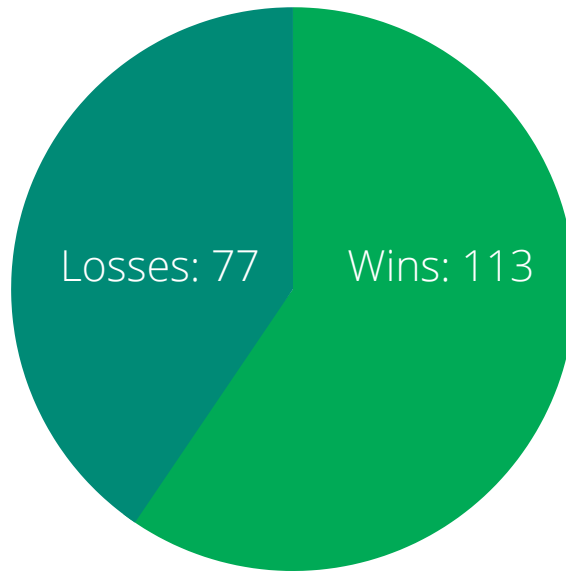


## Results

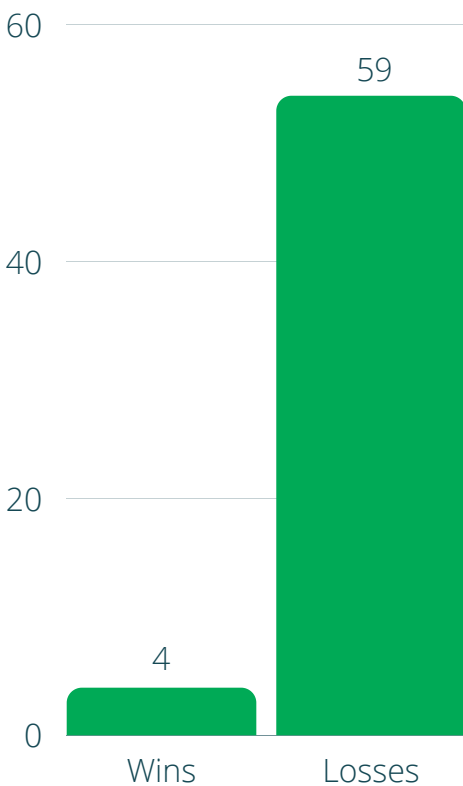

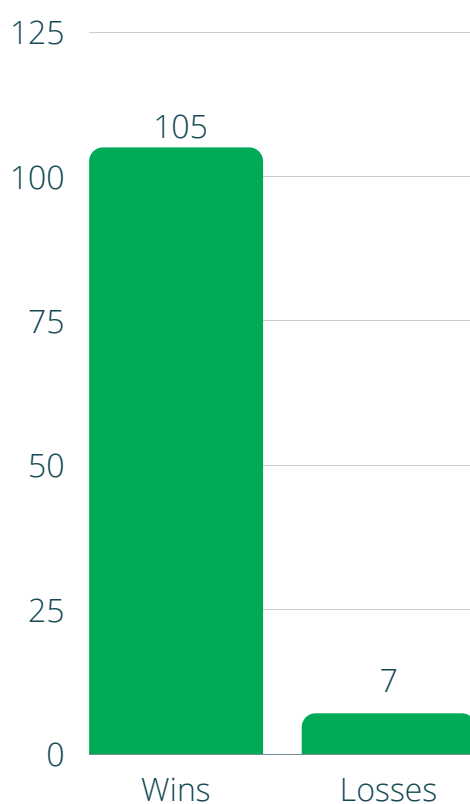
**Wins and Losses**



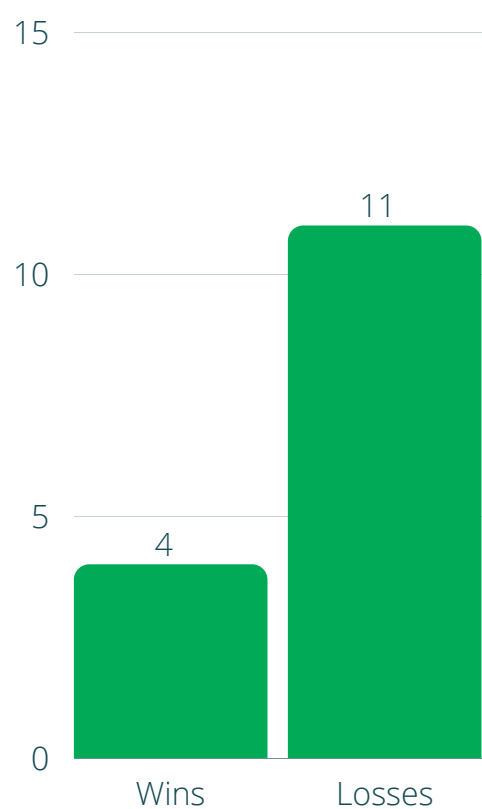
**Challengers Win vs. Losses**



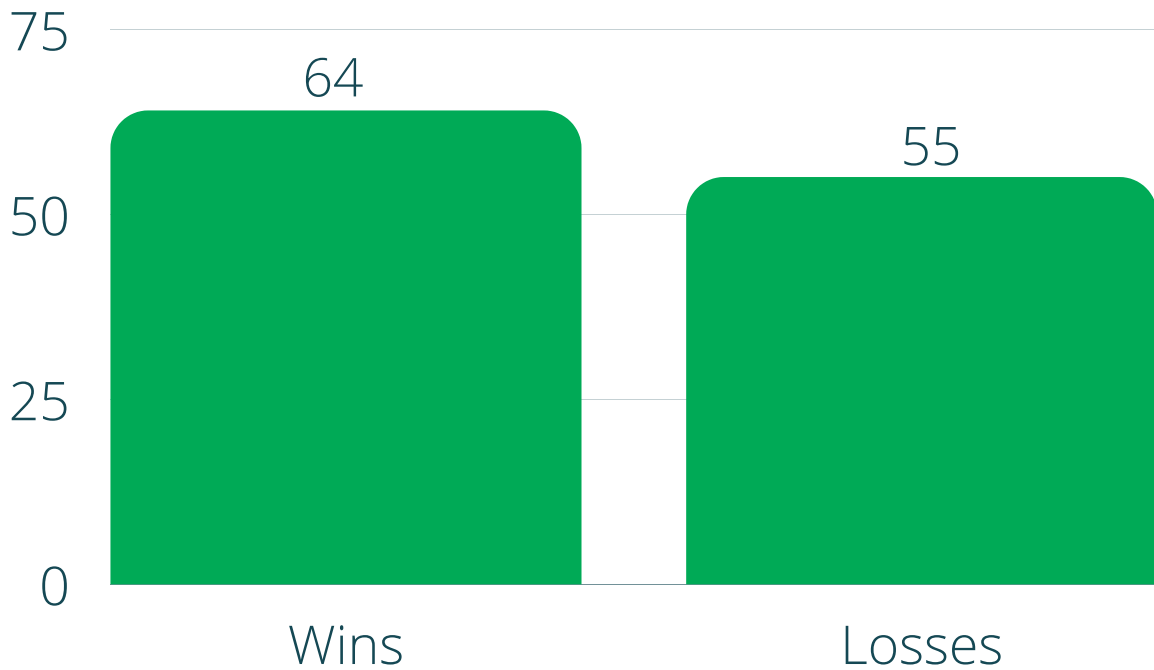
**Incumbents Win vs. Losses**



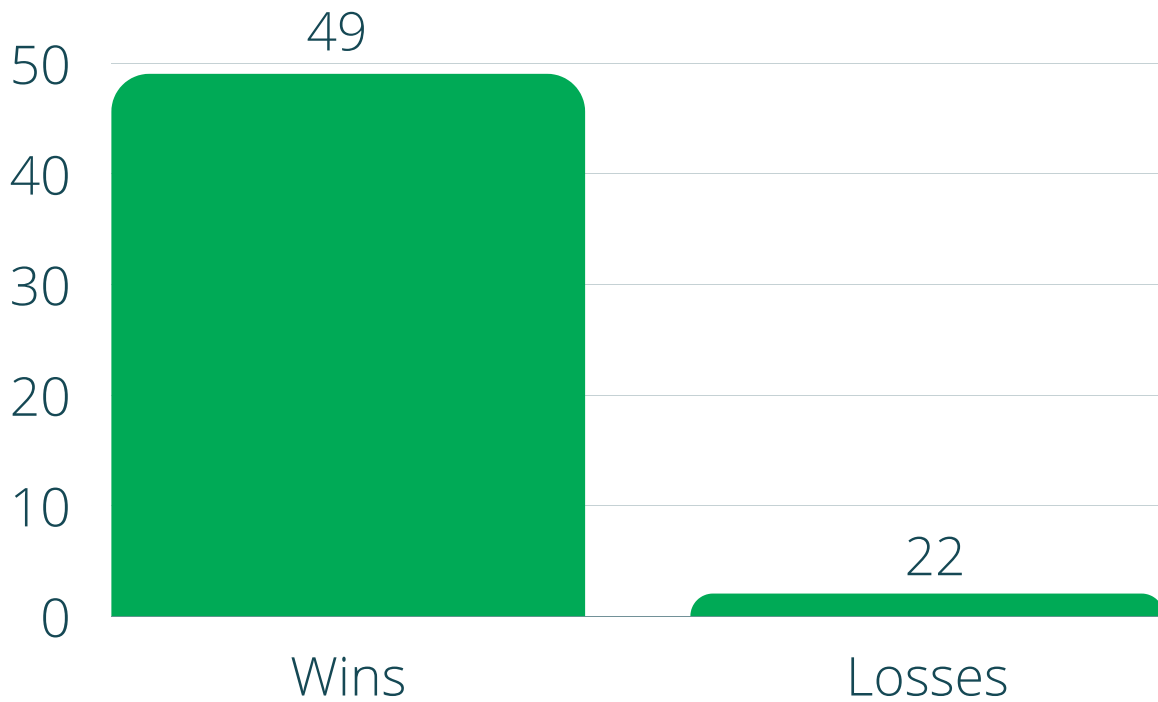
**Open Win vs. Losses**
