Victoria J. Mastrobuono Awardee – Laura Campbell

The 2025 Victoria J. Mastrobuono Award in Women's Health honors, for the first time, an activist: Laura, a Nevada mother whose traumatic pregnancies inspired her advocacy for full access to reproductive health care, especially during pregnancy and childbirth.

Laura and her husband, Spencer, faced a series of traumatic pregnancies beginning with a miscarriage, followed by second pregnancy resulting in a complicated C-section where their baby briefly lost oxygen but survived, and then a stillbirth caused by eclampsia that required emergency delivery. The experience of delivering a baby who wouldn't survive remains a painful memory.

Laura knows firsthand the dangers of abortion restrictions—maternal death rates are 62% higher in states with bans, according to the NIH. Now a mother to two healthy children, Keith and Lily, she felt compelled to act. Laura joined Nevadans for Reproductive Freedom for All, sharing her story and gathering signatures to place a constitutional amendment protecting abortion care on Nevada's 2026 ballot. Her courage and leadership make her a worthy recipient of the Victoria J. Mastrobuono Award in Women's Health.

Laura is a state board member of Nevada NOW and has served as Director of Action.
